Organization rules

1. This event can only host 6 teams of professionals.
2. This event consists of 6 professionals per team: 2 CETs, 2 Medics and 2 LEOs.
3. Each team can be supported by 3 observers, trainers, advisers or coaches.
4. You must build your team of 6 for registration, at least 2 weeks before the event.
5. All team members must be in good physical condition.
6. All participants must be covered by professional insurance for the duration of the event.
7. Each team appoints a captain.
8. The last practical information will be communicated only to the captain of each team registered on the online form.
9. Each team is required to have at least one medic (physician or specialized nurse) within the team during this event.
10. The medical team associates an EMT (paramedic) with a nurse or a physician.
11. This event consists in two hi-fi simulation multi victims' scenarios. The six teams are invited to participate in the first scenario before lunch break. The second scenario takes place in the afternoon.
12. The running order of each team will be randomized.
13. Teams deal through these 2 hi-fi different scenarios to demonstrate their physical, technical and non-technical skills under direct and indirect threat, as well as during the preparation of several patients for evacuation care.
14. Casualty care is presumed be delivered pursuant to the Tactical Emergency Casualty Care (TECC) Guidelines and Tactical Combat Casualty Care (TCCC) Guidelines as currently as prescribed by the Committee for Tactical Emergency Casualty Care (C-TECC) and the Committee on Tactical Combat Casualty Care (CoTCCC) respectively.
15. 18 Belgian and international experts score teams performances using video and standardized forms based on C-TECC recommendations (Committee for Tactical Emergency Casualty Care - www.c-tecc.org).
16. The performance of each team is scored based on validated grids. The main topics of assessment are tactics, respect of TECC principles, teaming and victims' management according to MARCHE protocol (No CBRNe issue).
17. The jury is sovereign in its decisions and the final ranking of the teams.
18. All complaints must be submitted by the captain of the complaining team to the president of the jury.
19. All firearms (real or fake), without exception, must be presented at the security checkpoint at the beginning of the event. No ammunition may be in the magazine or firing chamber at any time.
20. All firearms (real or fake), without exception, must be presented at the security checkpoint just before the start of each scenario.
21. Each team must be ready at the assigned meeting point 15 minutes before the scheduled timing.
22. All Competitors should refer to and wear his professional Individual Protective Equipment and Dress Code prior to beginning this event.
23. All team members shall be mission ready with all departmental issued equipment necessary to affect a rescue.
24. The minimum safety equipment to participate in the scenario consists of complete and adapted intervention clothing, safety shoes, helmet, eye and ear protection.
25. Eye and ear protection, as well as body armor for CET's and LEO's, are mandatory throughout the event.
26. Individual and common casualty care gears is provided to each team by the event organizer.

27. Most of the response equipment, including dragging and carrying equipment, is made available 15 minutes before the «go» of each scenario.
28. The rest of the material is made available just before the beginning of the scenario.
29. All tactical, medical and personal equipment that the team starts the event with must finish with them with the exception of medical waste and medical product wrappers and packaging.
30. A focused briefing and a warm-up are held before each scenario.
31. Each run lasts exactly 20 minutes.
32. There is no debriefing of the interventions.
33. Video recording of each intervention is available only for involved team members.
34. Any evaluator can stop the scenario because of serious security issue.
35. A stopped scenario because of security issue can not be resumed.
36. Victims are actors who are made up and assume a roleplay.
37. All noninvasive procedures can be performed on the victims using the available material.
38. Invasive actions will be timed by the jury.
39. All audiovisual recordings (sound, picture, video) are prohibited during scenarios.
40. No audiovisual recording taken during this event may be published without the agreement of the organizer.
41. Pictures are taken by officials. Please complete the image rights form you will receive and hand it in at the reception desk when you arrive. Hoods and Buffs are recommended if you wish to run anonymously.
42. Participate in the 2 scenarios and the 2 master classes (2 x 1 hour) is mandatory to value the event as continuing education.
43. All participants in this event acknowledge that they have read these rules and regulations and agree to abide by them.
44. The Province of Liege reserves the right to prosecute offenders.
